Section 5. Health and Safety Requirements for Sandspit Marina

Contractor Policy

A contractor is defined in the current Act as a person engaged by any person (other than as a worker) to do any work for gain or reward.

All contractors and their workers must be aware of the Health and Safety Manual before commencing any work.

A list of approved contractors will be kept and must be completed for all contractors undertaking work for the society.

All contractors working in Sandspit Marina Society must hold a Sandspit Marina Society Contractor Licence.

A permit to work is to be issued by the Marina for all hot work.

Approved Contractor Status

All contractors undertaking work for Sandspit Marina Society must complete a contractor safety induction process.

It is a requirement that all Contractors demonstrate competency, capability and commitment to Health & Safety in accordance with the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and its Regulations, Codes and Standards.

To this end Contractors are required to complete a health and safety assessment in the form of a questionnaire.

Prospective contractors must declare if they have been prosecuted for any offence under the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992 or the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015. They must declare if they have been issued with any prohibition or improvement notices by Worksafe NZ during the previous three years and if so, give details.

Contractor Obligations

Contractors are expected to wear or use any protective equipment necessary for the safe operation of their work.

Safety guards must be in place and used on all machinery operated by contractors.

Contractor's workers (including sub-contractors used) must be fully trained and competent to complete their work safely.

Contractors must advise their presence in the workplace before beginning work.

Contractors must ensure that all their workers are aware of Sandspit Marina Society Health and Safety requirements.

Any injury sustained or incident while conducting work for Sandspit Marina Society must be reported to the Safety Officer or management as soon as possible.

Contractors must report any accidents involving hazardous / toxic substances, spills or discharges or any breaches of permits or consents.

Contractor Health and Safety Performance

Contractor's health and safety performance will be measured periodically to ensure that their work practices meet the requirements of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.

A contractor safety checklist form will be used for this purpose.

Post Contract Evaluation

Short term one off contracts do not require an evaluation however ongoing contracts such as maintenance contracts should be evaluated at least annually to ensure that health and safety performance is acceptable.

A contractor safety checklist will be used to document the evaluation process and will be completed by the Safety Officer.

Reporting of Accidents, Incidents and Near Misses

All work related accidents, incidents, injuries and near misses must be accurately reported and accurately recorded by the Safety Officer in the Accident Register.

All notifiable events must be recorded. These will be investigated to ensure that corrective action is taken.

Near misses should be recorded to assess the risk they pose in order to prevent an accident / incident happening in the future.

Should a notifiable event occur management is to advise WorkSafe New Zealand as soon as possible (within 48 hours of the accident occurring). **This is a legal requirement**.

The scene of the injury or incident MUST NOT BE DISTURBED unless further harm or the potential for further harm exists.

The notifiable event is to be investigated & a written report supplied within a maximum time frame of 7 days of the occurrence.

Hazard Identification and Management

All hazards or potential hazards must be reported to management.

A risk register will be maintained that lists known hazards and the control measures applied.

All reported hazards or potential hazards will be investigated to assess their significance and if necessary they will be added to the risk register.

Summary of the Basic Safety Rules

- Report any safety hazards to the Safety Officer or manager promptly.
- All accidents and near misses must be reported.
- Wear protective safety equipment appropriate to the work.
- Plant and equipment must be operated by skilled or trained persons only.
- Inspect plant and equipment before use.
- Ensure safe and suitable power supply to all tools and equipment.
- No unauthorised visitors.

- Drivers are to ensure load security and complete a final check.
- Vehicles may only be driven by qualified and authorized personnel.
- When using hoists and lifting equipment, do not overload. Secure load and always move with caution. Be aware of pedestrians.
- Conduct a visual check for hazards at each new work site and observe customer safety rules.
- If unsure ask
- House-keeping and hygiene in all aspects provides a safe and healthy work place.
- Know the location of your nearest fire extinguisher.
- No alcohol or drugs allowed.
- Don't fool around in the work place.
- Be aware of evacuations and emergency procedures in your work place.

Hazard	Risk Control(s)
Manual handling & lifting	Ensure correct procedure is followed. Get help.
Slips, trips and falls	Housekeeping issue. Don't leave things lying around. Clean up after yourself. Watch your footing on wet surfaces.
Noise and eye damage	Wear hearing protection and safety glasses where necessary.
Alcohol and Drug Use	No persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol are permitted in the workplace. No drugs or alcohol in the workplace.
Stress and fatigue	If stress or fatigue becomes an issue report it at the onset.
Medical conditions and allergies	Advise management of any allergies (i.e. bee stings) and keep medicine close at hand.
Sun Exposure	Use sunscreen provided.
Dust	Wear protective equipment as required. Ensure adequate ventilation.
Training	Ensure staff are fully trained for their job and are supervised where necessary.
Repetitive strain injury (RSI)	Report any signs at the onset. Don't try and work through it. Take regular short rest breaks and try to diversify work tasks.
Children in the workplace	Parent's responsibility. Must be supervised at all times. Sandspit Marina Society recommend that all children wear life jackets on the marina.
Vehicles	Ensure registration and warrants are current. Drive safely. Report any faults or repairs needed. Observe speed limits.
Vehicle movement in	Wear a high viz vest in this area. Don't assume the driver knows you are
the hardstand area	there. Establish eye contact with the driver. Take care around vehicles reversing with trailers as they may not travel in the direction expected.
Winch and Cradle	Trained operators only. Move with caution. Don't let members of the public help. Use a spotter at all times.
Marina Tender (RIB)	Trained and authorised operators only. The RIB shall only be operated within the harbour limits. Life jackets shall be worn by everyone on board.

Hazard	Risk Control(s)
Quad Bike	Be aware of safe operating procedures. Use with caution. Be guided by the WorkSafe NZ best practise guidelines on safe use of quad bikes. Speed to be kept to below 10 kph. Helmet to be worn at all times when operating a Quad Bike.
Electricity	Ensure plugs, switches and connections are in good condition. Ensure all leads and appliances have a current tag.
Electrical Work	Only authorised, qualified personnel to carry out any electrical work. Lockout / isolation procedures must be followed at all times.
Tools and equipment	Report any faulty equipment. Ensure guarding is in place. Isolate before attempting repairs or maintenance. If unsure ask. Use an isolating transformer unless earth leakage is provided by another means.
Marina Walkways	Watch your footing and be aware of obstacles left by marine users. Request items be moved if they present a trip hazard. Ensure that you know the location of the nearest flotation device to assist any persons who have fallen into the marina.
Moving and Mooring Boats	Take care not to strain yourself if assisting with moving or mooring boats.
Adverse Weather Conditions	Ensure that all boat have been secured by their owners. Ensure that all loose items are secure.
Damaged Pontoons	Ensure there is regular maintenance on pontoons. Daily checks to be made and any defects rectified immediately.
Falling Objects	No work underneath anyone working at height.
Compressed Air	Take care that lines do not causing a tripping hazard on the floor, ensure that connections are secure and do not apply directly to the skin. Wear eye protection if using compressed air to blow dust from clothing.
Tsunami Warning Issued	Leave for higher ground immediately. Walk or bike if possible as cars get jammed.
